

DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION AND AWARENESS

Spanish nursing committed to cooperation

In Spain, FUDEN promotes nursing as agent of development and awareness, since it is a key part of the functional and organizational structure of the health system and the junction nexus between the health system and the community.

Access to health in conditions of equity, with the work of all necessary actors for the development of the community, is one of the challenges of cooperation. The awareness about this reality has focused the initiatives performed in the area of Awareness and Education for the development of FUDEN.

The population, the professional nurses, nursing students and sectors such as the young ones and the students are receivers of the FUDEN activities.

Seminars and courses

Make the nursing professionals aware about world inequalities, respect of human rights and gender equality are the purpose of the education seminars for the development formulated by FUDEN in 2016 with the Agencia Asturiana de Cooperación al Desarrollo and the Malaga City Hall. It is scheduled to be held in 2017.

Corresponding to the call of 2015, the Fundación para el Desarrollo de la Enfermería and the Malaga City Hall trained in February 2016 30 nurses from Malaga regarding gender equality and human rights.

Students

Student population awareness program about world inequality in matters of health. Prepared for the call of the year 2015 and beginning its implementation during 2016, FUDEN and the Granada City Hall have worked in the awareness of 350 students about the achievement of a fairer world. It is in 2017 when the organization of the activity for the teenager population is scheduled.

Awareness Seminars

In 2016, FUDEN organized dissemination activities for its nursing cooperation projects. It is necessary to point out the awareness seminars called "The right to health and sexual and reproductive rights", which took place in the city of Toledo between November 22 and 23, within the agreement of the Foundation and the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID) to improve the sexual and reproductive health in the region of Maradi, in Niger.

79 Spanish nurses attended the seminar. During two days, different experts in nursing cooperation analyzed the situation of women in Niger. The seminars had the direct testimony of Mme. Seydou Maimouna, general supervisor of the Centro de Salud de la Madre y el Niño (CSME) of Maradi and Dr. Bozari Harouna, assistant head physician of the Dakoro Health District, in Niger.

DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION PROGRAMS

Nursing cooperation, health and well-being

Fuden Cooperación Enfermera promotes programs in strategic sectors allowing a measurable and permanent impact on the populations' health. From a human rights point of view, the Foundation plans its work applying basic strategies in the promotion of the populations' health and nursing professionals, converted into development agents for their immediate surroundings.

Primary care and basic sanitation

From the frame of Law to drinkable water and basic sanitation, the purpose is to improve the health-sanitation conditions of the most vulnerable population, who live in a situation of poverty, through the training of nurses in education for health and sanitation care, promoting Primary Health Care, strengthening their capabilities and promoting the available means and resources. This is how FUDEN operates in countries like the Dominican Republic.

Emergencies

In many cases the first contact patients have with the health system is through nursing, particularly in environments of difficult access and rural areas, where they are the only resource. This is why it is so important to provide an emergency attention that solves the problems that arise, through Training and the creation

of teams capable of servicing the population. The FUDEN Cooperación Enfermera projects taken into account these types of citizens.

Maternal and infant health

Promote sexual and reproductive rights, reduce the mortality rate of women in childbearing ages, pregnant and that of children under the age of five are priorities of FUDEN, through the improvement of professional competence and nurse knowledge, midwives, matrons and accoucheuse in matters of obstetrician obstetrics, providing the necessary capacity in techniques for a clean and safe attention during childbirth and puerperium, providing the necessary means to contribute to an improvement of the mothers and neonatal health. These are the directives around which the Foundation programs can be found in Niger (call 2014), Nicaragua (corresponding to the 2015 call) and Guatemala (year 2014 call).

Professionalization

To alleviate the deficit of health professionals, particularly nurses, in less advanced countries from an economic point of view, if the purpose of the nurse professionalization programs, providing the necessary training for the development of their obligations, in cooperation with nursing schools and universities. In Equatorial Guinea FUDEN continues with the second

professionalization stage of nursing assistants in Gynecological-Obstetrics, initiated in 2015.

Institutional strengthening

The purpose is to promote the work of the local nursing organizations, which are endowed with the necessary resources for its correct operation. For this purpose, trade development is promoted, as well as access to knowledge and information technologies applied to health. Following these criteria, the Fundación para el Desarrollo de la Enfermería (FUDEN) works with all its local partners in America and Africa.

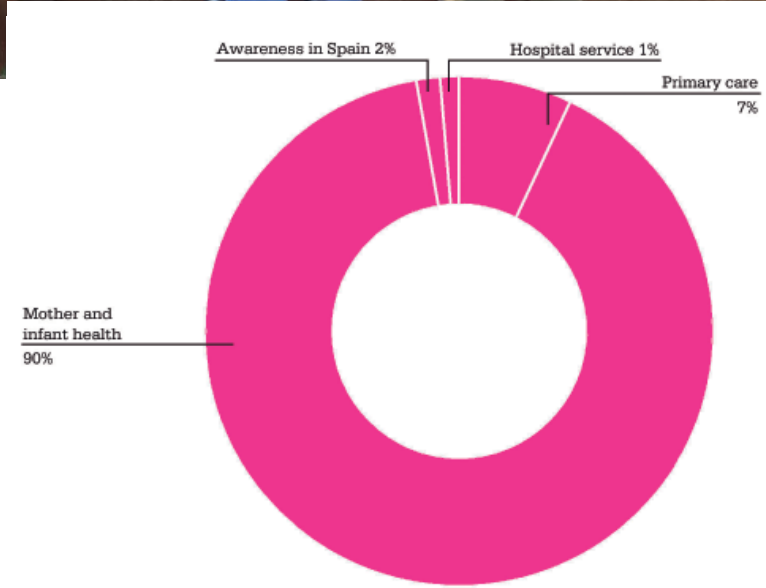
Transversal and specific axis

Gender approach, with a large impact in women strengthening, particularly in patriarchal societies, intercultural respect and environmental care are three transversal axes that FUDEN promotes in all its projects. Scientifically, the Foundation has promoted hospital care and the training of nurses in countries such as Equatorial Guinea.

INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE

Present in America and Africa

The Fundación para el Desarrollo de la Enfermería (FUDEN), through its Nursing Cooperation department, works since 1999 in the improvement of health assistance in different countries due to nursing development.

Currently, through several yearly calls, FUDEN performs nursing cooperation in countries of Africa such as Equatorial Guinea and Niger and America such as Guatemala, Dominican Republic and Nicaragua.

During 2016, FUDEN has continued with its nursing cooperation programs in Equatorial Guinea, with the professionalization of nursing assistants in gynecology-obstetrics and with the improvement of its hospitals health equipment.

The mother and infant health, as well as the promotion of the sexual and reproductive rights of the population, with special focus in teenagers, has been another of the work scopes of FUDEN in 2016, in countries like Niger, Guatemala and Nicaragua.

While in the Dominican Republic, the Foundation has continued with its support to the restitution of the health right and the improvement of living conditions of the population who lives in the bateyes in the Monte Plata province.

Niger

In this country, FUDEN and AECID have continued with the execution of an agreement to promote the right to sexual and reproductive health in the region of Maradi, through the strengthening of the public health system and community participation.

Equatorial Guinea

To improve level of health in Equatorial Guinea through the increases in the number of midwives is the objective of the professionalization program with which FUDEN has continued to operate in the African country.

In 2016, it has continued with the second professionalization stage of nursing professionals in Gynecology-Obstetrics, in cooperation with the company Marathon Oil and the Department of Health and Social Well-Being.

In the same manner, the AECID work project has continued, corresponding to the 2015 call, to improve the permanent training of nurses. Particularly in 2016, a continuous training plan has been defined and closed, which design is based in the identification of training needs performed in the whole of the country.

Lastly, the Malabo Regional Hospital has improved the endowment of surgical instruments and input of its surgical block thanks to a project performed in 2016 with the Government of Australia.

Dominican Republic

The FUDEN projects in the Dominican Republic have been focused on improving the exercise of the health right of inhabitants of the Monte Plata province. The work improves the access to drinkable water and the health-sanitation conditions of the populates who lives in the area bateyes, thanks to the initiatives financed by the Agencia Asturiana de Cooperación al Desarrollo and the Andalusia Parliament.

In addition, several similar projects corresponding to the 2015 calls have ended, performed in cooperation with financiers such as the Seville Provincial Government and the Oviedo City Hall.

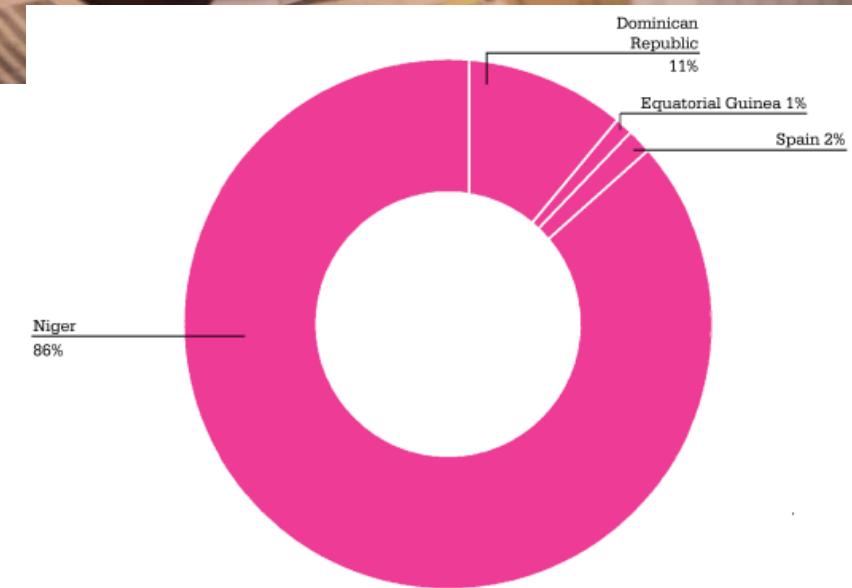
Nicaragua

In 2016, FUDEN has finished several projects to promote the complete health of infants from 0 to 5 years with particular focus in the prevention and the approach of malnutrition in the district of Central Zelaya, with the Galicia Government, and in the municipality of Somoto, with the Malaga City Hall.

In the same manner, another initiative to contribute to the restitution of the health, sexual and reproductive rights of men and women, with focus in the teenager population in the municipality of Tipitapa has been finished con la assistance of the Jaén Provincial Government.

Guatemala

In this central American country FUDEN and AECID have finished in 2016 a project to promote the sexual and reproductive health rights and the feeding of the Chiquimula district population.
